

TNBA SOUTHERN REGIONAL TOURNAMENT

RULES AND REGULATIONS – FAILURE TO READ IS NO EXCUSE

1. This tournament is open to all TNBA members, except professional bowlers, who reside in a Southern Region state. It will be operated under the tournament rules of TNBA and USBC. All entrants must have TNBA and USBC membership cards prior to bowling. TNBA membership cards may be purchased at the site at a cost of \$26.00 each. USBC membership cards may be purchased at a cost of \$24.00 each. To participate in the senior events, you must be at least 55 years of age at the time of bowling.

2. The mail-in entry deadline is November 2, 2019, and the full amount of fees must accompany the entry for same to be honored. Entries postmarked the 1st post office business day following the entry closing date shall be accepted.

3. Personal checks will not be accepted for any reason. The total entry fee in the form of Money Order, Cashier or Certified Check, must accompany the application, made payable to The National Bowling Association.

4. Entry forms must be filled out in their entirety. First and Last names (no nicknames, address (if applicable), TNBA & USBC numbers and average for each bowler. Any omissions may delay processing until all information is received.

5. Mixed Teams may be any number of men-women combination. Multiple entry for teams is allowed. Not more than 3 bowlers on the same team may re-enter. Must change at least two players on the team to re-enter

6. Multiple Entry is permitted for Singles and Doubles. Entrants may not enter doubles and not singles or enter singles and not doubles. You must enter both events. Bowlers will stay on the same lane for singles and doubles.

7. All Events: The first score rolled by a player on the team, singles and doubles will count towards his/her all events score. Actual and handicap pin count for all events will be used.

8. Bowlers must use their highest league average, based on a minimum of 21 games for the 2018/2019 season. This includes any Challenge Conversion averages. Bowlers without a 2018/2019 average will enter with the highest average from the following: A. 1. Highest league average based on 21 or more games from: a) 2017/2018 season or b) 2016/2017 season or c) 2015/2016 season or d) tournament average. B. Bowlers who do not meet any of the average requirements in item a, b, c or d. will enter with the highest of the following: 1. Current average from any league at the time of bowling of 21 games or more. League standing sheet must be presented upon check-in. 2. Bowlers who do not meet any of the average requirements stated in items A or B will be entered with a 220 average. The tournament management has the right to re-rate bowlers prior to the tournament and after the tournament has started based on the performance of the bowler. If a bowler is re-rated during the tournament, the re-rated average will be used for all squads bowled. No summer league averages may be used. No sport league averages may be used. USBC rule 319c. apply: Average Adjustments (rerating) A bowler who has had his/her average adjusted/rerated in accordance with this rule is required to report all previous assigned average adjustments/rerates, whether the bowler accepted the adjustment/rerate or not, at the time of bowling. Failure to comply with these provisions is cause for disqualification and forfeiture of entry fees and prize winnings. Rule 319d. Reporting Prior Prize Winnings apply. Rule 319e. Average Adjustment for Entry apply. The USBC 10 pin average rule does not apply.

The decision of tournament management shall be final.

9. It shall be each bowler's responsibility to verify the accuracy of his/her averages, (whether originally submitted by the bowler, his/her team captain, or others.) All averages must be verified through bowl.com or league standing sheets if average is not reported on bowl.com by November 24, 2019. Failure to do so may result in disqualification. It is requested that the verification be sent with the tournament entry application. To avoid disqualification, entrants must make average corrections by the end of the first game bowled.

10. Handicap for each game shall be 90% of 220.

11. Replacements shall be permitted at the discretion of the Team Captain and must bowl in the position of the original entrant. All rules and regulations herein likewise apply to replacements. Once a replacement has started to bowl, the replacement must finish the event being bowled.

12. The Tournament Management reserves the right to disqualify any entrant not in compliance with the rules of the tournament, TNBA and USBC. Premature termination of the tournament brought about by war, national emergency, or emergency causes relating thereto or therefrom, fire, natural disaster or any other reason beyond the control of TNBA Southern Regional Tournament shall cause, to the extent required thereby, all prizes, to be prorated in accordance with the number of entrants who have bowled in each of the respective events up to the time of such termination.

13. Proper attire required. No headgear (hat, cap, etc.). Tournament Management reserves the right to final decision on proper attire. Bowlers in Improper Attire will not be allowed to bowl. Bowlers may be rescheduled, but NO refund of their entry fee.

14. Team Captains are requested to report to the Tournament Management Office at least one hour before time scheduled to bowl to make any changes for the squad.

15. Events will be scheduled in the order names are listed on the entry form. Tournament Management time schedule will be final.

16. Team, Singles and Doubles will be scheduled. In the singles and doubles event, singles will be bowled first. No player may change position in any team or doubles lineup after the entry has been scheduled. Violation(s) will cause disqualification(s). Bowlers will remain on the same pair of lanes for all six (6) singles and doubles games.

17. It is the bowler's responsibility to check their scores after each game.

18. Tardy players will start in frame being bowled with zero being given for each frame missed. If a team refuses to start because a full lineup is not present, they shall receive zero for all frames which they decline to bowl. No blind score shall be permitted, and a bowler must bowl with and on the same lanes and at the same time his/her team bowls.

19. Provisional ball or frame will be used in situations where foul or legality of pin fall cannot be immediately resolved.

20. After entry has been received, no fees shall be refunded except in dire emergency such as strikes, lockouts, fires, etc., over which management has no control. After an entry has been received, and dates assigned by tournament management and not refused before preparation of the schedule, the entry fee cannot be refunded (USBC Rule 314). An effort will be made to sell spot(s).

21. Prize fees will be returned 100% in the event for which it is collected. Prizes will be awarded to handicap division and actual division winners. There will be at least one prize for every eight (8) entries, except all events, where the ratio will be at least one (1) for every twenty (20). Prize fund checks must be cashed in 90 days; or will be voided. A. The IRS requires TNBA to furnish 1099 forms to individuals with winnings of \$600 or more in any TNBA events in which they participate (including brackets). B. Failure to furnish an accurate completed W-9 may cause a delay of the prize check. C. Prize checks will be distributed within 30 days after the conclusion of the tournament (Rule 309) unless permission is granted to extend by USBC tournament certification. Any Protest or corrections pertaining to the prize fund results must be received in writing within ten (10) days after the distribution of tournament unofficial results. D. Any prize check requiring replacement within 90 days of tournament ending will require a \$25 replacement fee and \$50 thereafter. E. Prize checks, or replacement checks, must be cashed by June 30, 2020, or prize winnings will be forfeited.

22. Current Professional Bowlers regardless of Classification will not be permitted to bowl in this tournament. Past PBA/PWBA champions, regardless of classification, may be permitted to bowl if the championship was not within the last 10 years. Former PBA/PWBA members who have not held a card for the past two (2) years are eligible to bowl in this tournament.

23. PRIZE: a) Championships will be determined by the greatest total of pin fall in the category. b) Bowlers entered in all three events (where he/she has paid an all events fee) shall be eligible for the All Events Championship award. Scores bowled in Mixed Doubles Tournament DO NOT APPLY TO ALL EVENTS.

24. Anyone working in the host-bowling center may not bowl in this tournament.

25. By participating in this tournament, you hereby agree to the sharing of your average, bowling performance, and other related information between TNBA and USBC.
